The AMA warmly welcomes today's announcement that the Chief Medical Officer, Professor Brendan Murphy, will be appointed Secretary of the Department of Health.

Professor Murphy will take over from Ms Glenys Beauchamp PSM, Secretary since 2017, whose retirement takes effect from 28 February.

Professor Murphy will be the first medical doctor to serve as Secretary of the Federal Department of Health. The last doctor to head health was Dr Gwyn Howells, who held the position of Director General from 1973-1982.

Among other roles and achievements, Professor Murphy was formerly CMO and director of Nephrology at St Vincent's Health, and sat on the Boards of Health Workforce Australia, the Florey Institute of Neuroscience and Mental Health, the Olivia Newton-John Cancer Research Institute, and the Victorian Comprehensive Cancer Centre.

Dr Bartone also paid tribute to Ms Beauchamp for her services to health and the public service.

"Glenys Beauchamp is a dedicated public servant who will be remembered for her commitment to include the many medical and health organisations in a cooperative and friendly working relationship with the Department of Health," Dr Bartone said.

"Ms Beauchamp consulted very closely with all the key stakeholders in health to work for positive outcomes for patients and the community.

"The AMA wishes her well in her retirement," Dr Bartone said.
