The 'medical home' is the family GP

The AMA today released its new Position Statement on the Medical Home 2015.

The AMA has produced the Position Statement to contribute to the current health policy discussion over the future directions of general practice and primary care in Australia. AMA Vice President, Dr Stephen Parnis, said the Position Statement outlines key principles and requirements for the Medical Home if it is to lead to improved patient care in the Australian context. <u>READ MORE</u>

If a formal Medical Home model is to be introduced in Australia:

- 1. it must be appropriately funded, including to support administration, additional care coordination, and non-face-to-face work;
- 2. funding should complement existing fee-for-service arrangements, paid on a longitudinal basis;
- 3. it must utilise the patient's usual general practice/GP as the Medical Home;
- 4. it must be voluntary, allowing patients or GPs to opt out or reverse their decision;
- 5. it must impose minimal administrative burdens

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Coroners findings: the natural death of a person from hypertrophic cardiomyopathy

A copy of the Coroner Simon Coopers findings is available <u>HERE</u> regarding the "natural death" from hypertrophic cardiomyopathy of a person in Tasmania, together with advice from Associate Professor Dr McTaggart, which was relied upon in the coroner's findings and which highlights the need for greater knowledge about genetic

heart disease and the role played by the Genetic Heart Disease Registry of Australia (which includes a Tasmanian section).

Medibank unveils plans

Medibank has recommended reforms to private healthcare, which would deliver much-needed transparency, affordability and value for consumers in the healthcare system, as part of our submission to the Commonwealth Department of Health's review into private health insurance. <u>READ MORE</u>

Medibank's seven key recommendations outlined in the attached documents are:

- Improving information-sharing for consumers and insurers
- Standardising simpler products and terminology
- Ending cost-shifting from public hospitals to privately insured consumers
- Reducing the cost of prosthesis
- Reducing default hospital costs
- Improving competition and premium setting
- Rewarding early uptake of health insurance

In addition to saving up to \$3 billion per annum in health costs, Medibank's recommendations would encourage more Australians to take up private health insurance, helping to reduce pressure on the public healthcare system and at the same time improving the quality of patient care.
