The committee has continued to engage on a number of fronts to achieve better understanding of the issues facing doctors managing their patients within compensation systems.


In September 2015, Peter Sharman and Andrew Hunn presented a submission 'The Medical Voice for Health Outcomes' to the WorkCover Board on behalf of the AMA.

The submission contained significant proposals related to development of new clinical pathways to facilitate management of poor-prognosis 'complex cases' and mechanisms to allow treating doctors to flag patients who would benefit from exiting the system, rather than relying

on the current adversarial legal processes.


