The organising committee was overwhelmed with the success of the recent THC Conference, emphasised by record attendance numbers and committed health sector personnel and politicians remaining firmly in situ for the duration of this oneday event. With the theme of this year's conference #one team - working together to keep Tasmanians hospital thoroughly explored across the key topics and expert keynote speakers; hospital avoidance, a team-based approach with the ultimate goal to improve person-centred care, transitional/streamlined care in particular highlighting, and in some cases unique to Tasmania, the key indicators of a rapidly aging population, mental health, disability, end-of-life care, chronic conditions, heart disease and oral health.

This year the committee, as in previous years, looked to introduce new aspects to the event to enhance the delegates outcomes, and support the theme. They included art in therapy, GP Face to Face with the State's Health Minister, #hellomynameis name badges, and a conference app, all receiving very positive feedback.

On the reverse side, it was revealed that Tasmania has approximately 84,000 carers, primarily women, and it is these unsung heroes of the health sector that will help keep people out of the hospital, however with the tremendously successful hospice@HOME program now without funding leaving everyone asking why?





SALARY MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS AGREEMENT 2017

DOCTORS PAY DEAL AND TRIAL NW RECRUITMENT DRIVE

Hodgman Liberal Government has finalised negotiations with our doctors as part of the Salaried Medical Practitioners Agreement. Under the Agreement, doctors will receive a 2 per cent pay increase per annum effective from July 1, 2016 to July 1, 2019, which is in line with our wages policy. It follows on with our successful negotiations with our nurses, paramedics and other health professionals over the past three years.

While we have been successful in recruiting, it is no secret that the North West has always struggled to attract health specialists. In a move to further address this, the Hodgman Government has also negotiated the provision of a new recruitment and

retention allowance of 25 per cent for a two-year trial period for specialists that will be located in the North West region.

The fixed-term trial is aimed specifically at testing the effectiveness of such an allowance in meeting the health needs of the North West by attracting and retaining specialists to the region, as well as helping to decrease the overall health costs by reducing the use of locums. To increase our ability to both recruit and retain our medical workforce in the North West, the allowance would be offered to both new and existing medical specialists.

CODEINE

AMA BACKS TGA ON CODEINE

The AMA has reiterated its support for the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) decision to make codeine a 'prescription only' medicine from 1 February 2018. AMA President, Dr Michael Gannon, said today that the AMA fully supports the independence of the TGA in making decisions about medicines scheduling, including for codeine. "There is compelling evidence to support the decision to make codeine prescription only," Dr Gannon said. "Deaths and illness from codeine use have increased in Australia.
