ACCC AUTHORISATION

Recent discussions held during ICM in Hobart revealed the AMA holds an ACCC authorisation allowing general practices to engage in intra-practice price setting.

This means that GPs throughout Australia who practise as separate entities in a single practice can legally engage in:

- intra-practice price setting;
- collective bargaining, as a single practice, in relation to the provision of VMO Services to public hospitals;
- collective bargaining, as a single practice, with Primary Health Networks.

This authorisation expires next year, with the AMA having lodged an application to renew the authorisation for a further ten years.

The ACCC has responded to our application and is putting the heat on us to give examples of where general practices have used this authorisation, specifically in relation to collective bargaining with public hospitals for VMO services as well as Primary Health Networks (including the former Medicare Locals).

<u>ATTACHED</u> are the questions that have been put to us. If members can provide specific examples of where you know it has been used or can give me some idea on how negotiations are normally conducted at the local level between practices and hospitals (e.g., after-hours services in rural) we will then be able to piece this together into some sort of cogent response that demonstrates the benefits the authorisation provides.

FUNDING OF UP TO \$8,000 FOR HEALTH SECTOR WOMEN AVAILABLE

Building on the significant developmental momentum achieved earlier in the year, Women & Leadership Australia is administering a national initiative to support the development of female leaders across Australia's health sector.

The initiative is providing women with grants of between \$3,000 and \$8,000 to enable participation in a range of leadership development programs. The scholarship funding is provided with the specific intent of providing powerful and effective development opportunities for health sector women; however the funding is strictly limited and has to be allocated prior to the end of 2017.
