PHARMACY EXPANSION

The Pharmacist-administered Influenza Vaccination Program in Tasmania has now been in effect for two years and many pharmacists have been providing influenza vaccines in pharmacies during this period.

Program changes have been approved for commencement in 2018.

I. Workplace and off-site influenza immunisations programs Pharmacists will be allowed to conduct workplace and off-site influenza immunisations programs for healthy adults with appropriate authorisation and approval. Pharmacists have been made aware of the importance of maintaining safe professional standards in providing immunisations outside pharmacy settings, and to maintain collegiate and operationally cooperative relationships with other providers already providing influenza vaccines in these settings

CODEINE

CODEINE CHANGES UPDATE

Codeine (3-methyl morphine) Rescheduling Background as from 1 February 2018, all over-the-counter codeine-containing medicines for pain relief, cough and colds will be available by prescription only. This decision was formalised in December 2016 by the Commonwealth Government on the advice of the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) as the Australian national medicines regulator. The TGA undertook a comprehensive review of the clinical evidence available for these products, as well as significant consultation with key stakeholders.
