MEDICAL WORKFORCE

DATA

The Department of Health will publish aggregate Medical 2016 workforce data from the NHWDS in the form of summary health workforce data (Fact Sheets) and an **Online Data Tool which is accessible through the Department's** <u>WEBSITE</u>. This is **the first publication of medical factsheets on the Department of Health's website**. The package of medical factsheets (attached) includes a general factsheet on **Australia's medical workforce and individual factsheets on 36 of t**he medical specialties which will accessible through the NMTAN website as well as the above website. <u>LINK</u>

The general medical factsheet notes that 106,634 medical practitioners were registered in Australia in 2016. Of those who held general registration, 93,773 were employed in the medical labour workforce. Regional and remote areas continue to have a substantially lower ratio of practitioners per head of population and overseas trained practitioners continue to form a key part of the medical workforce in rural areas.

Key facts emerging from the Medical 2016 data include:

- Of the 91,341 general registrants who were employed in medicine, 86,550 (94.8 percent) were employed as clinicians. Non-clinicians made up the remaining 5.2 per cent (4,791), and include administrators (1,444), teachers/educators (1,029), researchers (1,296) and other (1,022);
- Between 2013 and 2016, the total number of clinicians increased by a headcount of 8,576, from 77,974 to 86,550 and Full-time Equivalent (FTE) increased by 8,226 from 84,094 to 92,321. Over this same period, the number of non-clinicians increased by a headcount of 357 from 4,343 to 4,791, and the FTE by 245 from 4,287 to 4,532,
- The average age of the medical workforce in 2016 was 45.9 years. The average age of males was 48.3 and for females was 42.5;
- The gap between males and females is decreasing. In 2013 38.5 per cent of the workforce was female compared to 40.7 per cent in 2016;
- There was a slight decline in average hours worked from 2013 to 2016 from 42.9 hours per week to 42.4 hours per week;
- The number of registered and employed medical practitioners across states and territories continues to reflect population size, with more than half (56.6 per cent) of the workforce located in NSW and VIC in 2016; and

 In 2016, 79.2 per cent of the workforce worked in major cities, 13.6 per cent in inner regional, 5.8 per cent in outer regional and 1.4 per cent in remote/very remote locations.

The Symposium will bring together key stakeholders and researchers to discuss the social, legal and clinical dimensions of elder abuse and neglect in Tasmania.


Professor Wendy Lacey, a leading national expert on Elder Abuse will deliver a keynote address followed by a series of workshops.
